All year round, enthusiastic guides welcome people of all ages who are interested in science. They offer tours to match the interests and knowledge of each group, whether it's children, students or adults.

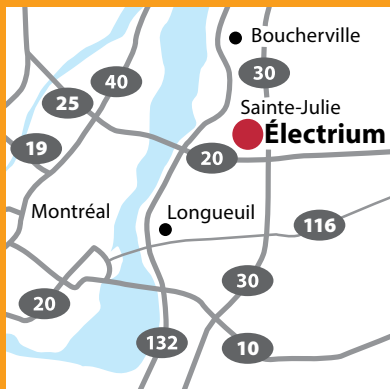
School Tours
